damage to property and deaths worth millions of Ghana Cedis has been experienced.

In the first quarter of 2023, the GNFS reported 2177 fire outbreaks. In comparison to 2023 in the first quarter of 2022, this means a decrease of around 9 %. This decrease is seen as a result of increased awareness raising campaigns and improved fire prevention measures by the Ghana National Fire Service.

Most fires produce an immense amount of smoke that is highly toxic. In fact, smoke is responsible for more fire fatalities than flames. A smokey fire can have the following effect on humans within:

30 seconds disorientation
2 minutes unconsciousness
3 minutes death

Timing is critical during a fire.

To ensure your safety, you must know how to prevent and respond to any fire emergency. Fire and life safety involves numerous safety issues including prevention, fire suppression, and emergency evacuation/response.

HOW TO AVOID FIRE OUTBREAKS





Are you always scared of being a fire victim?

Here's how to avoid it:

- Check after cooking that all sources of fire and heat are out.
 Do not overload electrical sockets.
- Dispose every hazardous waste properly.
- 3. Keep all ignitable substances out of reach of children.
- 4. Don't use phones in the kitchen.
- 5. Practice caution with candles and mosquito coils.
- **6.** Practice with your family, especially the children a fire alarm at home.

- Independent smoke alarm
- Fire blanket for burning oil fire
- Fire extinguisher
- First Aid Box
